### **Executive Summary**

#### District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

**Mission:** With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

#### School Collection Development Plan

Oak Ridge HS serves 2564 students enrolled in grades ninth through twelfth. The student population's ethnicity is made of 50% Hispanic and 50% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 50% White, 47% Black, 0% Native, 2% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 1% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Dennis Gonzalez and Assistant Principal Sarah Harper. Oak Ridge HS is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include Battle of the Books, Air Force ROTC, Aviation Magnet, Hospitality Management Magnet, National Honor Society and our 3DE by Junior Achievement Magnet.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Oak Ridge HS indicates that the average age of the collection is 2007 and the number of books per student is 7. The <u>American</u> <u>Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, Oak Ridge HS does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- hundreds of acquisitions in recent years with more slated for 2023-2024.
- More books will be added to our Language Section {400's Dewey Decimal Range}.
- Oak Ridge looks to increase the variety of its Computer Science collection.
- Our students access 1,117 eBooks, audiobooks & digital magazines available in Sora.
- Among Oak Ridge's strengths is its collection's diversity and inclusion offerings.
- Many low level high interest selections are available for check out in our library,
- Purchase of new books will include an emphasis on African American & LatinX / Hispanic heritage selections, including relevant graphic novels.


